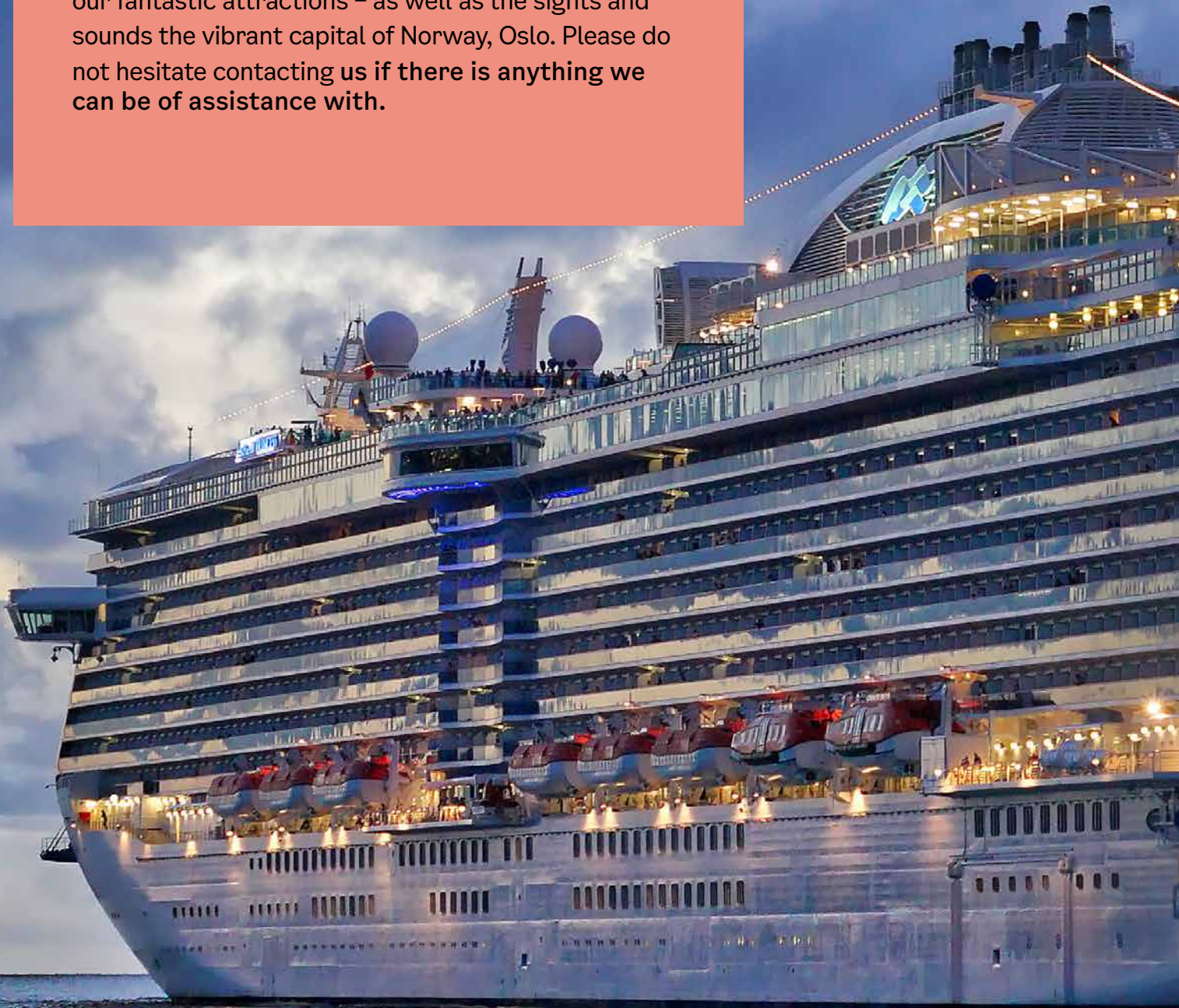

Terms and Conditions

Vessels which call Port of Oslo and use the public quays will be subject to a quay charge. The quay charge is calculated on the basis of the gross tonnage (GT) of a vessel as stated in the vessel's tonnage certificate, pursuant to the International Convention on Tonnage Measurement of Ships of 1969.

Quay charge for cruise ships - rate per 24-hour period. The following tariff applies:

For the first 4 000 GT	NOK 3 500
For all tonnage exceeding 4 000 GT, per GT	NOK 0.61
Minimum rate per 24-hour laytime period	NOK 3 500

Quay charge for private yachts - rate per 24-hour period. The following tariff applies:

Per GT	NOK 3
Minimum rate per 24-hour laytime period	NOK 3 500

Port of Oslo is not liable for any misprints.

Discounts for cruise vessels

Environmental Port Index (EPI) has been introduced as an economic incentive to support sustainable and eco-friendly cruise operations and to make it less profitable to call to port for ships that cause pollution. EPI applies to all cruise ship calls and implies changes to the quay charges. At the latest 72 hours after departure, cruise ships shall report data from their port of call. An EPI score will be allocated based on this data.

The score ranges from 0 (lowest) to 100 (best). Quay charges will subsequently be subject to a proportionate change as follows:

For a score below 30: $2 \times (30 - \text{EPI})$

For a score above 30: $-3/7 \times (\text{EPI} - 30)$

If a ship fails to report data within 72 hrs, it will be appointed a score of 0.

If a ship has facilities for shore power, it will be appointed a minimum score of 30.

International Ship and Port Facility Security (ISPS) charge and cruise ship passenger fee

ISPS charge and passenger fee will be payable when Port of Oslo conducts controls for entry into enclosed areas by cruise ships and other passenger ships. ISPS charges are charged on the basis of each 24-hour laytime period. Laytime is calculated from the time of berthing until the time of unberthing. Laytimes of less than 24 hours duration will be charged at the 24-hour period rate and thereafter for each 12-hour period commenced.

ISPS charge and passenger fee:

ISPS charge and passenger fee will be calculated on

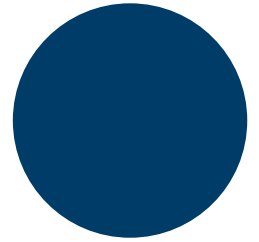
ISPS charges, per person, per 24 hours	NOK 13.30
Passenger fee, per person, per port call	NOK 3.00
Minimum ISPS charge, per port call, per 24 hours	NOK 2 680

the basis of number of passengers in transit and the number of disembarking and embarking passengers. The use of inspection boats, if requested by a ship or due to elevated security level, will be charged at NOK 3 000 per hour.

In a case where incurred costs for entry control unreasonably exceed the tariff charge, a surcharge will be levied to cover documented additional costs.

Ship waste disposal

Pursuant to the Regulations relating to Pollution Control (FOR 2004-06-01 no. 931), Chapter 20, Port of Oslo has established facilities for the disposal of waste and cargo residue from ships.



Fees for ship-generated waste

All vessels calling at public quays will be charged for waste disposal services, regardless of whether or not they deliver waste to the disposal facilities. Leisure craft which do not pay the quay charge are exempted from this scheme and will therefore not be charged. The waste disposal fee will be calculated according to the number of persons on the ships arrival notification in SafeSeaNet (crew members plus passengers).

	Fee per port call	Pr. person

Minimum waste disposal fee: NOK 100 per port call. A 50% surcharge per 24-hour period will be payable for laytime periods in excess of two 24-hour periods. A 50% surcharge will be payable by vessels whose last port of call prior to arrival in Oslo was outside Northern Europe, i.e. ports located north of 48° N latitude.

An additional charge may be payable by vessels requesting to dispose of quantities that are larger than those considered reasonable in proportion to vessel's size, normal operation and time at sea since their last port of call. An additional charge may also be payable by vessels which have failed to comply with the notification requirements laid down in chapter 7 of the Regulations. Fees may be reduced or waived if a vessel can provide documentation that its waste is regularly disposed of at another harbour or if justified by other special considerations. Fees for waste disposal are collected by Port of Oslo and are invoiced along with quay charges.

Special rules concerning cruise ships

For cruise ships the waste fee payable to Port of Oslo also covers the disposal of liquid oily waste, within the normal working hours of the port, i.e. on weekdays from 07:00 - 15:30. Reasonable quantities of liquid oily waste, defined as the quantity produced in the ordinary operation of the ship since the last port called at, shall be accepted. This quantity shall not exceed 5 cubic meters. An additional charge to cover the extra costs will be payable by cruise ships requesting to dispose of liquid oily waste outside of normal working hours or exceeding reasonable quantities.

Water supply

Water supply to ships and water supply vessels, etc. according to volume measured either by meter or when refilling a pre-gauged tank with a given content.

Minimum charge per supply	NOK 754

An extra charge will be made on water supplies delivered on Saturdays, Sundays, public holidays or outside normal working hours on weekdays to cover overtime costs for the water supplier:

Overtime surcharge, Mon. – Fri. 15:00 – 20:00, pr. hour	NOK 325
Further overtime surcharge, pr. hour	NOK 650

Orders received before 12:00 hours on weekdays can usually be expected to be performed without additional overtime charges unless the customer specifically requests that delivery should take place outside normal working hours. Orders for delivery of water supplies on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays must be placed no later than 12:00 hours on Fridays or on the last normal working day preceding a public holiday. Orders are binding and will be charged at a minimum rate plus any overtime charges according to the standard rates.

Turnaround fee

When cruise ship passengers start or finish their cruise trip in Oslo, a turnaround fee will be charged in addition to the ISPS charge. The amount of the fee will be determined by agreement with the ship's agent.
